Excerpt from Rev. Lara's reflection March 19



The concept of finding balance in our lives is fitting for this time of year, the spring equinox. We think of it as a moment of perfect equilibrium in the annual cycle of seasonal changes. ... Equinoxes - and solstices have deep rooted cultural significance around the world, and they have been observed since time immemorial. ...

Our lack of balance is most evident when we think of the harm we have done to the earth and ecosystem. Many communities across the globe are enduring extreme weather events exacerbated by climate warming. Mother Nature reminds us that she has her own idea of what balance is. Part of what makes balance challenging is that everything around us is changing. And the lack of balance can make us feel, well, even more unbalanced. It may require that we change, and change is hard, especially when it is not something we invited. Sometimes imbalance is necessary, it is the only thing that shakes us up enough to change. ...

Rev. Susan Manker-Seale says we are being "...called back into balance, back...to the awareness of the continuous presence of the environment around us and within us ... called to remember our relationships and our dependencies ... and to do so with wonder and appreciation." I love that idea, rather than looking at our lives with judgment, to look at it with wonder and appreciation. Even the parts of it we don't like, the parts we would much rather forget or wish never happened...Life is different every day and we are different every day. And balance will be different every day – the very practice of finding balance may keep us, well, off balance. But if we are intentional. If we remind ourselves to look for balance in whatever we are doing. If we quiet ourselves, and open ourselves with wonder and appreciation, a new way of being will reveal itself. We will hear that sweet sound my friends. The sound of being called back into balance.

New men's group to meet Tues. March 21

The New Men's Group meets regularly to discuss various issues that are important and of interest to men. This group acts as a support vehicle in an atmosphere that promotes trust and confidentiality. Currently, at First Parish we have two distinct, but related Men's Groups as follows:

- 1) The men's group that was formed in early 1993 and is still operating today. It usually meets on Wednesday evenings in our church but keeps its membership to no more than 10 individuals and is therefore "closed" to any new members unless an opening occurs. Dan Lyons (lyons531@gmail.com) acts as the coordinator for this group.
- 2) And a "NEW "Men's Group which also meets at the church, usually on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month, at 7pm. It was established in early 2023 and is currently "open" to anyone, even those outside our church, subject to memberships approval.

Sometime this year, it will likely become necessary as well as advantageous to split into two groups--A and B, due to the high interest expressed, keeping membership numbers between 8 -12 individuals, per group. This ensures that everyone can be heard and more thoroughly address each member's specific needs and wants. March Board News

1. The Board held an additional meeting on March 1 to discuss the Ministerial Transition.

From the regular meeting on March 15:

- 2. The Board received a communication from Al Adams, Moderator, regarding Section V of the Bylaws seeking clarity in regard to the names of Congregational Meetings. This discussion was tabled until there is further exploration of church bylaws.
- 3. The Board voted to clarify that the First Parish COVID-19 Policy does not restrict food or drink on church premises except when universal masking is required.
- 4. Coffee Hour was discussed, and it is determined that regulation of Coffee Hour is under the purview of the Membership Committee. The Board voted to issue the following statement: "The Board supports the Membership Committee's decisions in regard to Coffee Hour. The Board voices its concern that Coffee Hour will not become burdensome to church volunteers and believes that fellowship is the goal".
- 5. Alicia shared the Properties Report. At present one of the heating boilers is no longer operational due to unanticipated malfunction. Except for a deductible of \$1,000, the entire cost for replacement is covered by church insurance. Additional costs relate to the need for a metal lining for the chimney vent. A new hot water boiler is determined to save significant money going forward. It is stressed that despite ongoing hopes for heat pumps, a backup system will continue to be essential. The Board voted to issue an order to Fieldings Oil Co. to proceed with a new hot water boiler per their proposal and that the church moves to eliminate the steam boiler and convert to hot water heat for the entire building. This will include possible costs for new chimney vent and other equipment.
- 6. The Finance Report from Chris Wells was much appreciated for its clarity and organization. Paperwork has been signed to enable Chris to access investment account material.
- 7. There is considerable enthusiastic discussion amongst church members about possible ways to celebrate the 250th Anniversary of our building. Thanks to everyone working hard on this project. We look forward to seeing the final proposals!
- 8. The Minister's, Administrator's and Music Director's reports were received and appreciated.

9. Additional Committee Liaison Updates: Music: Ginny spoke about the success of the recent music concert. Social Justice: Vicki shared concern about a recent unclear incident finding our Black Lives Matter flag torn. The flag will be replaced.

10.Ministerial Transition: The Board has voted for the following individuals to the Transitional Minister Search Committee: Andrea Rohde, Paul Beach, Lisa Slaughter, and Chris Wells. On behalf of the congregation, the Board thanks you for taking on this vital work in building our beloved community!

- Food and Beverages are now allowed in the church, but only water is allowed in the library and Sanctuary.


