Seeds of love, seeds of joy, seeds of pride. It was glorious to see people of all ages: babies, children, youth, adults, seniors, spread out on the grass, smiling, laughing, dancing. Feeling, if only for that moment, free to be themselves.

And yet at the same time, I know, in some places other seeds are being sown. Seeds of intolerance. Several people called South Church to complain about the event, expressing their beliefs. Seeds of hatred. Those of us in the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, plus community know all too well, the fear and violence that those crops have yielded.
