Singing together is like group swimming with good folks Going off in the same direction but with slightly different strokes


Singing together need not be a form of high art Just sharing time and space, with each doing their part

We will ... Excerpt from the reflection given by Rev. Lara Campbell, Sept. 18

Something to remember as we meet together next Saturday:

There is so much that I love about our covenant here at First Parish. In our covenant, we explicitly commit to direct communication with one another. This is a bold and precious, and in some ways, deeply counter-cultural. Direct communication fosters an environment where we are free to bring our whole selves.

Direct communication is not something all of us are taught growing up. Our culture tends to discourage confrontation and encourages "not causing a fuss." But not wanting to cause a fuss doesn't mean that issues magically go away, and sometimes the things that bother us come to light in indirect ways. ... [Two of these are] triangulation and in the desire to only want to give feedback anonymously.

Unfortunately, as our lives and social interactions have increasingly moved online, there has been a vast increase in this kind of feedback. We have become used to it. But anonymous feedback doesn't foster any type of relationship. While the giver might feel better for having expressed their concern, it leaves the person or group or community receiving the feedback without any avenue to be able to clarify, to understand, and to contextualize the information.

Now, I recognize that this is not easy. That direct communication can be, well, scary. It requires that we take a risk. I still get a knot in the pit of my stomach when I need to have what feels like a hard conversation. But, what we know, what I know, in the heart of my hearts, is that almost every time I have taken this risk, been courageous, the outcome has been far better than I expected. In fact, sometimes when I have started what I thought would be a difficult conversation, two sentences in I learn that I had simply misunderstood, and a quick conversation that I had dreaded has quickly and cleanly been resolved. In fact, I have found my relationship strengthened. In direct communication, bonds are made, connections are deepened, and in the end, we will all be better for it.

- communicate directly, honestly, and compassionately, especially when there is conflict.

- share our pain and sorrow, lightening those burdens that are too great to bear alone.
- encourage one another to grow, opening our minds and hearts to new ideas; challenging our assumptions having conversations that matter.
- share responsibility for fulfilling our vision for our church, our community, and our world.

Community Conversations to continue

Including teens from the Civil Rights Team at Kennebunk High School and several people from our congregation, 27 attended the Conversation at Kennebunk Town Hall on Monday, September 19.

The topic was "The Changing Cultural Make-up of the USA and what that means." Facilitators Linda Stathoplos and Karen Plattes dug right into the controversy embodied during the "Unite the Right" torch parade in Charlotsville, VA, five years ago. People at the discussion seemed to agree that the "fear of others," is a way of explaining racism, and one way to combat this is for each of us to reach out and get to know people of different ethnicities. Civil Rights Team faculty advisor Greg Smith pointed out that structure and policy change are needed before we can expect people's values to change. He helped with a project to buy 300 copies of the book, *The Far Away Brothers* by Lauren Markham. It tells the story of two immigrants and their journey to the U.S. Greg distributed 25 books after the program and said the students who are reading the book are planning to hold community conversations about it.

Many Towns One Circle (MTOC), a community group supported by the First Parish Social Justice Committee, sponsored the conversation. The purpose of MTOC is to identify racial bias in ourselves, challenge racial injustice, and work together to build a more inclusive community.

Covid-19 protocol updated

Dear First Parish Members and Friends,

The Board of Directors voted on Aug. 31 to relax the social distancing and mask requirements (pending ventilation information) for events at First Parish. After receiving data regarding ventilation from the properties committee, we are ready to proceed and able to announce that masks are now requested, but not required for activities at First Parish UU Kennebunk.

To do this, we need your help.

~Until we can afford air purifiers, at least 2 windows must be opened in the room you are in. EVERYONE (not just the meeting leader/organizer or staff) is responsible for double checking to make sure that the windows are closed before exiting the room.

~The cost of air purifiers is outside of our current budget. We would appreciate any donations to the church (in addition to your regular pledge) to offset this expense.

~If someone requests that folks mask, please do so. We do not know, nor is it our right to know, why someone has made this request. We trust that the request is valid. (If you need people to mask, you may want to speak with your group leader/organizer for support in making a mask request.)

As it says in Our Vision Now, we inspire compassion in ourselves and others...We work together to build a loving, just, and peace-filled world. Please have a mask handy (or get one from the office) so that we, as individuals, live into our Vision as a congregation and community.
