The Circle Game

Excerpts from the reflection given May 21 by Rev. Lara Campbell

"And the seasons they go round and round, And the painted ponies go up and down, We're captive on the carousel of time," writes Joni Mitchell as she tells the story of a child becoming an adult, expressing the inevitability of time and growing up. ... I first heard this song as part of the ending ceremony for a regional Unitarian Universalist youth conference in Michigan. ...

Rites of passage, like the ones we are honoring today, and others like the child dedication which we will do on June 4th, are one of the central parts of my call to ministry. And being asked to create new ways to mark transitions is truly a great honor.

Now, 23 years since that youth conference, ... 16 years since starting seminary, [and] 9 years since ordination and being called to be your minister, I find myself at a watershed moment, "Captive on the carousel of time ... We can't return we can only look Behind from where we came, And go round and round and round In the circle game."

With my departure on the horizon, I have been thinking a lot about seasons and transitions. ... One of the best pieces of advice I was given was to be intentional, to make time, to say goodbye. To share with people in individual meetings. So far, I have met with

11 folks and I have 5 more on my calendar. Each of these meetings has been a little different. In some we have laughed, in others cried, and often we have done both. We have reminisced and shared our hopes for the future.

In order to accommodate more meetings, I have opened up my calendar for appointments into the second week of June. These sessions are for all at First Parish, if you have been reticent, consider this your personal invitation. If you have not already done so, please call Allison in the church office to schedule a time to meet with me.

While I know that saying goodbye can be hard, I also know how important it is to do it. We have and will make mistakes; we are human and imperfect. But I also know that putting forth the effort of being mindful in our goodbyes can help to release us.

We all play the circle game, sometimes multiple times during our lives. But with intentionality, the turning of the carousel doesn't have to make us dizzy or unsteady. It can be a gentle ride that allows us to look back, but then move forward.

Can you paint? Can you drive a nail?

Our church side stairs, where the vast majority of our church attendees enter or exit the church, are in dire need of complete repainting and some repair soon. To date, most of this painting has been performed by several Properties Committee members, including Al Adams, Beth Anderson, Andrea Rodhe, Patrick Conner and me. But we've had a very busy year! We need others, like you, to share this chore more equitably—especially now that Spring is here.



Please contact me if you can help, even for just one day or an

hour or two—any day or time that suits your schedule. We hope to put together a task force to address the above, while also increasing our base number of Friends and Helpers, going forward. Our beloved church, now 250 years old (1773-2023), will continue to need your help and love even more.
