A letter from Rev. Tori

Dear ones,

I am grateful for the love and well wishes you all sent me for my ordination this past weekend. It was a moving service that reminded me of the powerful connections that run between and



among us—connections that bring us all closer to the kind of love-filled world we all yearn and strive for every day.

I was grateful also for some time for rest afterward. My mentor and internship supervisor, Rev. Frank Clarkson, during the service on Saturday, blessed and charged me to prioritize Sabbath and rest in my ministry – to avoid email when I'm off, take care of my body and spirit, and be gentle with myself. Wise words to remember and hold close.
