The customer attendance was much higher in general, we sold out all the pastries and luncheon offerings, the cemetery tour was attended by 50 people, there was much interest in the Church history from more than a dozen people, and the music entertainment was superb. WIONN (Welcoming Immigrants Our New Neighbors) Request

There are refugee families in Biddeford that need what we call Care Teams. A Care Team is a person or group of people who commit to up to 2 years of attention to a family. The Care Team gets to know the family, visiting once every 2 weeks or so for a while, then less time as a family gets acclimated. It is mostly about friendship and caring about them. We have access to household goods, clothing, shoes etc. and we have a group of people who all work together. We have a training for Care Teams and lots of support. Refugee and Asylum Seeker News

DONATIONS: Thanks to all of you who have donated so much for the new Mainers in Biddeford. Your generosity has been ever so appreciated. We have enough of most everything now and no more storage space so hold on to any donations. Our families are pretty stable now, but more folks are likely to come to Biddeford from the new wave of asylum seekers in Portland.

All we need now are diapers in size 5 and 6, and gift cards to Market Basket. You can purchase gift cards at the store and give them to Marylyn Wentworth, or you can give Marylyn money and she will purchase the cards. We use Market Basket as they carry halel food.

TEMPORARY HOMES FOR PORTLAND ASYLUM SEEKERS: The folks housed in the Portland Expo have to be out by mid-August. Permanent housing will not be ready. Therefore, people in surrounding communities are being asked to share their homes with an asylum-seeking family on a temporary basis if they can. In towns outside of Portland this means forming a group who will house people and transport them to Portland as necessary for legal meetings and other support meetings.
