Would you like to help some of the people who have recently immigrated into Maine? This is a perfect time to fulfill some of their needs.

There are many, many Iraqi families in Biddeford. Their needs are a bit different than ours. They tend to have large families and extended families and cook their meals in a single BIG pot and serve on BIG platters. You can leave things at church with Marylyn Wentworth's name on the boxes or bags and she will pick them up. These are some things we need to find:

BIG pots (not aluminum or teflon)

BIG frying pans (not aluminum or teflon)

BIG trays and platters

BIG canisters for flour, sugar, tea, coffee etc.,Pressure cookers, meat grinder!! (surprisingly big need) electric mixer, kitchen wash cloths, kitchen dish towels, bath towels, Sewing machine, Children's toys, preferably not plastic or small pieces that could choke little children, kitchen equipment like potato masher, ladle, spatula, mixing spoons, hot pads,cleaning stuff like scouring pads and powders, dish soap, laundry soap.

He came to break the bonds of sin to teach a Father's love, To lead the way through trials here to a world of light above, That we might to the world go forth with faith for our defense, And through its hardest strife still bear our childhood's innocence, We thank Thee, Father for the love which lights the path of youth, We thank Thee for the Saviour's words of Hope and Trust and Truth, May we remember Thy commands and choose Thy sacred ways, Our hearts be taught to love Thy will, our lips to speak Thy praise.
