Support the Black Live of Unitarian Universalism

On Sunday, February 11, 2018, First Parish UU, Kennebunk took part in the UUA initiative *The Promise and the Practice*. We took a Special Offering to support the Black Lives of Unitarian Universalism (BLUU). BLUU is an independent organization, fiscally sponsored by the UUA, led by an executive director, a community minister, and a volunteer Organizing Collective, which provides ministry for, and by, Black Unitarian Universalists, while also working to expand the role and visibility of Black UUs within our faith.

UU congregations are being asked to make a financial commitment to help fulfill the \$1 Million dollar match opportunity by contributing at least \$10 per member. Additionally, the Northern New England District has agreed to match *up to \$100,000 more* for every additional dollar our Maine, New Hampshire and Vermont churches donate to BLUU.
