They usually give a **discount** for our church and advises that anyone picking mention they are from First Parish and doing it for the fundraiser. Fundraising to support the Free Black Community archaeological dig!

We have raised \$1553.00!!
Thank you to all of those who have donated!!

Kennebunk is home to one of the few known Free Black Communities in Maine. I have been working with Kathy Ostrander-Roberts to secure funding of phase 2 of the archeological dig.

We have been offered a **challenge match** from a member of our congregation who wishes to remain anonymous. If we raise \$1000 the donor will match that amount, which we have done! Thank you for your support with this important archaeological dig. The goal is to have the location designated as a National Register Historic District.

Please note: It is critically important that the site remain undisturbed. If you know the location, please do not disclose it. If you think you know the location, please don't disclose it. If you have any curiosity about the site – please, please, please, resist any temptation you might have to go looking for it. In order to retain the historic nature of the site we need to leave the area alone. We are concerned that scavengers will destroy the site before we can get the dig under motion. We implore you to treat this information with the utmost care and respect.

You may drop off a contribution to this project at FPUU any time. If you write a check please put freed slaves project in the memo. Feel free to ask me any questions you might have about this important project. Thank you, Rev. Lara

WIONN (Welcoming Immigrants Our New Neighbors) Request

There are refugee families in Biddeford that need what we call Care Teams. A Care Team is a person or group of people who commit to up to 2 years of attention to a family. The Care Team gets to know the family, visiting once every 2 weeks or so for a while, then less time as a family gets acclimated. It is mostly about friendship and caring about them. We have access to household goods, clothing, shoes etc. and we have a group of people who all work together. We have a training for Care Teams and lots of support.
