# A few notes about our in-person worship service on August 1st

Worship will be both online and in-person starting at 9:30 am. Those joining in-person will gather on the lawn outside the meeting house, weather permitting.

#### Please be aware that the congregational well-being task for is recommending the following:

- Masks must be used (because we cannot socially distance and the delta variant is very contagious)
- There will be programing for the kids in the area between the building and the hearse house
  - Please bring a lawn chair (if you forget we will have the plastic church chairs)





- For joys and sorrows we will ask you to submit a written slip of paper for Rev. Lara or the Worship Associate to read, they will also read the joys and sorrows from the chat window.
- We will not be singing we may hum softly



- We will not "greet your neighbor" or hold hands at the end of the service.
- There will be no "coffee hour" in person, but there will be for those online
- Restrooms in the building are open one person at a time, they are now single use, gender non-specific

WIONN or Welcoming Immigrants our New Neighbors is a local, interfaith group that assists New Mainers in Biddeford and Saco. The intent of the group is to help families assimilate into their new culture by providing household goods, furniture, diapers, and most importantly friendship. Care Teams work closely with families as friends and neighbors. WIONN has several special funds that improve the lives of our new neighbors, including an education fund to help people attend college, a fund to assist with legal issues such as asylum, work permits, and citizenship, and a rent assistance to help with security deposits. For those of us in First Parish who are part of the Care Teams, we can attest to the value of WIONN and the satisfaction of being truly helpful to people we come to respect and love. - **-HOW WILL THIS WORK?** Each month a different and approved non-profit organization will receive one half of our regular Sunday cash collection.
- **-WILL WE SHARE EVERY SUNDAY FOR THE FULL MONTH?** Yes, except that July & August will be combined to allow for summer time's lower attendance.
- -WHY COLLECT EVERY SUNDAY? We recognize that not everyone can be in church each and every Sunday or may not have their extra funds on hand. NOTE: Due to the Pandemic's effect on gatherings/social distances, we "currently" cannot rely on personal Sunday collections, although we hope & trust to return to this approach sometime soon.

### **Community Outreach Services - COS**

COS offers assistance: food, fuel and many other things, to our neighbors in Kennebunk, Kennebunkport and Arundel. To make an appointment:

- 1) Contact the General Assistance officer of your town or
- 2) Call-207-985-6069 or
- 3) Go online to <a href="https://calendly.com/cosfoodpantry/foodpantryvisit">https://calendly.com/cosfoodpantry/foodpantryvisit</a> to select a 10-minute time slot. After you confirm your time you will be forwarded to a website to provide COS with your Food Pantry preferences. This pantry provides fresh produce, meats and dairy items along with non-perishable foods such as canned goods, cereal, pasta, pet food, household items, etc.

You may pick up your food during your scheduled appointment time at the COS Food Pantry, 19 Park Street in Kennebunk (driveway to the left behind the playing fields).

Appointments can be made for Mondays 12pm-3pm, Tuesdays and Thursdays 3pm-6pm and Fridays 10am-1pm.

<u>To donate food</u> to COS: "Nonperishable food items can be placed in the bin near the entrance to Hannaford, Kennebunk, or in the bin at the COS location, 19 Park Street, Kennebunk (behind the playing fields and playground) Thank you!"
