SHARE THE OFFERING

Share the Offering, formerly referred to as Share the Plate, has been enhanced by your Social Justice Committee and approved by your Board of Directors. This new and more consistent approach will enable us to actively express our Unitarian Universalist values, while reaching out to a larger community.

- **-HOW WILL THIS WORK?** Each month a different and approved non-profit organization will receive one half of our regular Sunday cash collection.
- **-WILL WE SHARE EVERY SUNDAY FOR THE FULL MONTH?** Yes, except that July & August will be combined to allow for summer time's lower attendance.
- -WHY COLLECT EVERY SUNDAY? We recognize that not everyone can be in church each and every Sunday or may not have their extra funds on hand. NOTE: Due to the Pandemic's effect on gatherings/social distances, we "currently" cannot rely on personal Sunday collections, although we hope & trust to return to this approach sometime soon.
- **-WHAT IS CURRENTLY THE BEST WAY TO CONTRIBUTE?** You may mail your check payable to FPUU indicating in the check's memo section "Share the Offering". Another option is to log into website www.UUKennebunk.org and select "Plate Offering", which allow you to contribute using your credit card. Either way, please try to regularly contribute to these approved non-profits, which is now all the more important.

-WHERE DOES MY PERSONAL FPUU PLEDGE FIT IN?

Your Pledge will continue to be allocated only toward those budgeted programs and expenses which FPUU membership previously approved.

HOW DO I RECOMMEND A NON-PROFIT AS A RECIPIENT? Please contact your Social Justice Committee to complete the comprehensive application. They will be happy to work with you and answer any questions.

Share the Offering for the month of July and August

July and August Share the Offering will be for Welcoming Immigrants Our New Neighbors (WIONN). First Parish will start a special fund for legal aid for WIONN. It is almost impossible for asylum seekers to actually receive asylum right now without a lawyer to represent them. Pine Tree Legal and ILAP are the only 2 free legal services and they are more than overwhelmed. Many retired lawyers have offered their services, but it is still not sufficient to take care of the needs.

There are several remarkable families in Biddeford right now enmeshed in this frustrating process without sufficient help. These are people who have suffered enough, people who have courage, resilience and determination, AND walked here from Ecuador! We want them as our neighbors, and we can help that happen by being generous with our plate offering for the next 2 months.

Coming this Fall: UU Wellspring, Year Two

What is UU Wellspring?

UU Wellspring is a 10-month Unitarian Universalist program of spiritual deepening and connection. It offers participants an opportunity for more joyful living, increased congregational leadership, and faithful justice making in their lives and in their communities. UU Wellspring is for congregations interested in fostering spiritual growth in a uniquely UU context through an intentional, curriculum-based program of daily spiritual practice, spiritual direction, study and reflection, and small group meetings. Since its development in 2005, UU Wellspring programs have been implemented in more than 26 congregations nationwide.

How did UU Wellspring year one go?

This first year, our pilot year, is almost over. Rev. Lara and Amy Wood have been co-facilitating a group of seven members, all of whom had expressed an initial commitment to their ongoing spiritual growth.

What do I need to know if I'm thinking about participating in UU Wellspring year two?

Our second year will start in September, beginning with a weekend retreat. Two-hour group sessions will be held every other week throughout the church year. Food can also be delivered to you if you cannot come to a food pantry. This service is available to anyone living in the 3 towns of the Kennebunks. Simply contact the General Assistance office of your town. You do not need to qualify for General Assistance for this service.

The Last song we sang together Live in Person was called "We Have Enough". https://youtu.be/8wAWXZafJyU It was lovely and inspiring. The congregation also seemed to enjoy it. We did not know that it would be the last time we would sing together Live for an uncertain longtime. All services at FPUU moved to Zoom. When that happened, the choir continued to meet on zoom and brainstorm possibilities of how we could 'virtually' both sing and practice together. If we're all on Zoom at one time and try to sing together there's always a delay and it makes great cacophony of sound, not a joyful noise.

Molly our very creative music director challenged us to sing songs for the congregation all together. Her idea was to sing individually, recording it and sending her a copy.

The first time we tried this, just a few of us sang as we each recorded "We Shall Be Known by the Company We Keep" by MaMuse. https://youtu.be/D7USAHkqyeA We had sung this live at previous services. It was one of the choir's favorite songs. But this time we were to individually sing our part and Record it. From the Archives

June 2020

A few bits from E.E. Bourne's "History of Kennebunk:

Anyone have a relative in their past with some of the more unusual ones?

"We find on the early records of the town, on old deeds and other ancient documents, the following Christian names of persons who were residents in Wells and Kennebunk: Bazelial, Hezekiah, Jedediah, Lazarus, Sarathiel, Zachariah, Zebulon, Bathsheba, Comfort, Consider, Dorcas, Dorothy, Diadema, Hepsea, Hepsibah, Iset, Jemima, Jerusha, Johannah, Katherine, Keziah, Lowhannah, Mercy, Merriam, Merribah, Panoply, Patience, Patty, Pethular, Philadelphia, Philomela, Prudence, Shuah, Susannah, Tabitha, Temperance, Terza."

"Cape Porpus was totally destroyed by the Indians the tenth of August 1703. Bradbury says it probably never had contained more than two hundred inhabitants up to that date. Some of the former residents returned and a few new settlers came in; in 1714 the population continued to increase and in 1719, on petition of the inhabitants, the town was reincorporated by the Massachusetts General Assembly and its name was changed to Arundel.

'The greatest fall of snow ever known in New England was in 1717; the storm continued six days and the depth of snow was eight feet upon a level. Many buildings in the country were buried up in the drifts."
