FPUU will be part of the Summer Lunch Program again this year! The Steeple Repairs Project has Begun!

June is approaching us this week and as planned the Steeple will be in repair mode for the month. You will find a 135-foot man-lift on our grounds next Monday being managed by Port Painting, Inc. A week later you will find 4 tents ganged together to do final fitting of the false windows at the top of the steeple. We are also replacing three railings of four at the clock level and one rail at the belfry. Five of our eight column bottoms will also be replaced. To save costs, we will be looking for some volunteers in the next three weeks to help paint the rails/balusters and window panels in the tents.

Port Painting, Erik LeBrun, will also paint the front face of the church and carpentry repairs by Nate Davenport. Theron Wentworth, a fine-cabinetry carpenter, has fabricated the oval window trim and panels in his shop. Saco manufacturing is fabricating the turning the balusters and columns. Volunteers, Stacy Wentworth and Hervé Lavoie, will support construction and coordinate work logistics.

The steeple was completely surveyed by Resurgence Engineering and Preservation, Inc. giving First Parish Preservation Foundation another opportunity to write a third grant for \$30,000 additional funding on this project. The total project cost is at \$45,000. The draft report finds this steeple structurally, excellent condition thanks to the years of upkeep done by other members of this church. Your Spare Bedroom can help the church!

First Parish offers professional development workshops for science teachers every summer. The workshops, which teach the guided inquiry method, have grown from the humble beginnings of 9 physics participants in 2006 to 42 this past summer in biology, chemistry, and physics. Graduates of our workshops give them rave reviews and their popularity is largely driven by word of mouth. This program is beginning its 12th season and has been made successful by the generous volunteer efforts of the FPUU membership! The program not only supports UU faith in science, but also is our biggest fundraiser. The reason we raised more than \$25,000 through this program last year is — our spare bedrooms! Members and friends welcomed one or two science teachers into our homes, so they can have a place to sleep. They get their meals at church or at local restaurants. This "spare bedroom donation" enables teachers to attend our programs, because it lowers their overall expense. Our hospitality and the excellence of our program spell success.

This summer's program will take place two weeks: July 22 - 27, and July 29 - Aug. 3. Naloxone

In an effort to reduce opioid overdose, we have been given a dose of Naloxone.



What is Naloxone?

Naloxone is a medication designed to rapidly reverse opioid overdose. It is an opioid antagonist—meaning that it binds to opioid receptors and can reverse and block the effects of other opioids. It can very quickly restore normal respiration to a person whose breathing has slowed or stopped as a result of overdosing with heroin or prescription opioid pain medications.

How is Naloxone administered?

The injector has voice and visual guidance that make it easy to administer naloxone during an opioid overdose. The prefilled auto-injector is used to administer naloxone in the outer thigh through clothing if necessary (even blue jeans) whether face up or face down.

Where is our dose of Naloxone located at FPUU?

The auto-injector is in the AED, which is located at the bottom of the stairs across from

the kitchen.

If you are interested in learning how to administer this life saving medication please speak with Rev. Lara.
