## Roof and other projects in the works

As you approach the church from the south, be sure to look up at our new roof! The side facing the Kennebunk Library is complete. The north side as well as the Hearse House roof will be replaced soon. The work is being done by Nate Davenport Carpentry.

Although the Kennebunk Historical Commission approved our request to install solar panels on the roof, this will not be possible. Our consultant structural engineer declared that our 220-year-old-building could not support the weight of the panels. Because of this disappointing news, we will have to find another way to access sustainable power.

Bathroom renovations are a work in progress. New toilets have been installed in the former men's room and one in the former women's room. The rooms have also received a scrubbing and fresh coat of paint. Both will be gender neutral. New flooring is being planned.

## Work progressing on church Library

The Arts and Improvements sub-committee and other volunteers have been working hard in the church library. The town's original library contained about 3,000 books! Old, dusty, and mildewed, they were causing air quality issues. Many people could no longer use the space.

On a sunny day, you might have seen three or four of us brushing the edges of the pages, which were caked with dust, and wiping the covers of every book, before wheeling them into the Parish Hall for members and friends to look over and buy. We sold a number of books, the top sale being a full set of Dickens. However, there was little interest in owning these books, some of them nearly as old as the church itself.

A diverse team including several former librarians evaluated all books for condition and relevance — UU and local history, world religions, and others. Local institutions were contacted but had no use for them. The church will retain the most relevant for our use and place them back in the library. Other shelving will be available for various church groups as well as AA.

Our goal is to make the library a healthy, comfortable place. It will serve us for meetings and also as a resource center and library. It will honor our past history while also reflecting who we are today.
