"On"-gathering Water Communion (online ingathering) September 13th, 2020

On Sunday, September 13, we will celebrate the gathering of our community and we invite you to contribute your water. Whether your water comes from far-away lands, from a place of spiritual renewal, or from somewhere closer to home. From the kitchen tap that fills pots and cleans dishes, from the hose spigot that waters your garden, or if you use some water that we have set out just for you.

Ways to Participate – We will be collecting your water in advance in order to make a video for the service. Please wear your mask and practice physical distancing.



Option 1: Come by First Parish during one of four Water Communion Drop off times. Rev. Lara will have the bowl set up to receive your water and will take a short video of you putting your water in the bowl.

- Tuesday, September 8, 10am-12pm
- Wednesday, September 9, 2pm-4pm
- Thursday, September 10, 5pm-7pm
- Saturday, September 12, 9am-10am

Option 2: If none of the above times work for you to drop off, please contact Rev. Lara at uukennebunkminister@gmail.com and she will schedule a time to meet you.

Option 3: Put a small amount of your water in a secure container (think pill container or recyclable bottle) and leave it in the basket on the First Parish porch by 10 am Saturday, September 12. It will be added to the bowl during the service. You can send a photo of you and your water to Rev. Lara at uukennebunkminister@gmail.com by 10 am Saturday, September 12 for it to be included in the video.

Option 4: If you are unable to leave your home, please contact Rev. Lara at <u>uukennebunkminister@gmail.com</u> and she will arrange for your water to be picked up.

News Flash! Community Food Pantries have moved!

The COS (Community Outreach Service) Food Pantries are now located at Parsons Field, 19 Park Street in Kennebunk. The building is behind the playing fields, tennis courts and playground (the former Teen Center).

<u>If you need food assistance</u>, the pantry is open to our neighbors in Arundel, Kennebunk and Kennebunkport. Changes have been made in how COS distributes fresh and non-perishable food items, household supplies and personal items. This is both to support the increased demand for the food pantry, and to offer our neighbors more and better choices. COS is so grateful to the Town of Kennebunk for making this beautiful building and location available as the new headquarters for COS.

The first day of operation at this new location, 19 Park St. in Kennebunk, is for the Produce Pantry, Friday, 9:00-10:00 am. Entry is by appointment, with tickets for appointments available there starting at 7:30 am Friday.

(As I write this article, I (Kathe Wright) do not have the food pantry schedule for next week, but be assured the Food Pantry will be open and available on many weekdays! Stay tuned. My best suggestion is to contact the General Assistance Office of your town for current information.)

- **-WILL WE SHARE EVERY SUNDAY FOR THE FULL MONTH?** Yes, except that July & August will be combined to allow for summer time's lower attendance.
- -WHY COLLECT EVERY SUNDAY? We recognize that not everyone can be in church each and every Sunday or may not have their extra funds on hand. NOTE: Due to the Pandemic's effect on gatherings/social distances, we "currently" cannot rely on personal Sunday collections, although we hope & trust to return to this approach sometime soon.
- **-WHAT IS CURRENTLY THE BEST WAY TO CONTRIBUTE?** You may mail your check payable to FPUU indicating in the check's memo section "Share the Offering". From the Archives

A Step Back In Time... Part One

I think that it was sometime in late October or early November that I first saw our own restored clock sitting in the Parlor. I must say that it was love at first sight. I could not believe that for all of my years that the clock hands in the steeple had been telling me the time of day, I did not know that such a simply elegant mechanism was the driving force. Wow! If the truth be told, I was somewhat embarrassed to have not known.

Later, I attended the first public meeting of the First Parish Preservation Foundation. It was at that meeting I knew I had to be part of the effort to reinstall our clock, to once again announce the time of day to an expectant community. For too long now, people had been wondering why our clock was on time but twice a day. So, in late November I went with Peter (Ashley) up the tower to the fourth level and the clock room adjacent to the attic.

Then, as only Peter can do, he proceeded to fill my head with more information than it could hold. The laundry list of deficiencies was long and what needed to be done to correct them was precise. I listened patiently, knowing there would be plenty of chances to play catch up later. I was also served up, that day, a rather complete history of our first clock, the so-called "Crane Clock". Then, onto our E.Howard clock from its installation in 1885 or so, to its eventual failure. Peter was just getting wound up, I was getting exhausted.

Soon after starting the job, I met with Peter and David Graf, our clock expert. That began a wonderful working relationship and later friendship. David's passion for tower clocks and obviously, *our* clock, quickly rubbed off on me and I just had to create a sound protected space for it. It became clear to me that if that were done, the community would have a greater chance at enjoying this timepiece for another century.

I asked David at that time if I were to get the carpentry far enough along, did he think we could get the clock installed in time to have a celebration and ring in the new year. He was slow to answer, thinking of all that was left to do. He finally said that he thought it was doable, but that he would need a week for a trial run before the New Year. I was excited and floated the idea to some church members. It didn't take me but a few more days to realize that although it was doable it would mean just too many loose ends to tie together at a later date. This would add unnecessary stress to what was becoming such joyful work! Plus, I had recently vowed to not let stress enter my life if I could help it.

When I first started the work, I had no idea that over the next couple of months, I would climb those well-worn stairs as many as 350 to 400 times. For starters, the day my grandson, Zander helped move the first pieces of lumber up to the clock room, I counted 20 trips! I also had no idea what a step back in time would transpire for me.
