# From the Archives

Every time I cross Durrell's Bridge from the River Road to Summer Street these days, I think about Rev. Daniel Little.

One day walking back from the port to his home on Summer Street (which is still there) he heard a sound. Not a bird, not a fife. Not a natural sound at all. It sounded like a signal. This was a relatively peaceful time for the settlers due to the Abenaki and the British spending more time attacking the French up north than in Maine. But there were warriors occasionally and Little feared that he might be in danger. Concerned for his safety and that of his family, he determined the only way to avoid being seen was to abandon the bridge route and crawl down the bank into the tall grasses and mud. It probably seemed like an endless journey, and he must have been caked in mud and grass bits, but he got home eventually. To his relief his family was unharmed and the Abenakis had passed peacefully through the village. Perhaps he over-reacted. Maybe there was no harm intended. But it stayed with him throughout the remainder of his days. He made many attempts, some successful and many not, to try to bring his version of the Gospel to tribes up and down Maine.

So next time you cross that bridge, take a look at the low tide mud and consider what that journey must have been like. This story is from Apostle of the East by Russell M. Lawson's fine book.

Sex (got your attention). Sexuality. Having sex. Not having sex. Being sexy. Identifying sex. Changing sex. Learning to talk about sex. Approving or condemning various activities or relationships involving sex or sexual behavior and consequences. Wow! Our human lives are filled with, if not occasionally preoccupied with, issues involving human sexuality. Yet, many of us even in this "enlightened" era of human and church history are still frightened or naive or socially pressured into ignorance or shame or unwilling behavior or discussion regarding this important aspect of our lives. How do kids learn about this? What has this to do with Shared Ministry, you ask? As a loving, caring, sharing, nurturing "religious" community, we are fortunate to have a ministry which provides to one another ways to be more responsive and responsible about these issues.

First, we have OWL, which is a wonderful program developed by UUA, standing for "Our Whole Lives". This is a curriculum in which Rev. Lara is well trained and experienced, and recently joined with Molly H. and Rich G. and others to teach and engaged with youth from the church and community for enlightened, frank, values-based sexuality education. A similar program is also in the works for adults.

Secondly, on an ongoing basis within our worship services, committee attention, leadership and wide participation of our members in community activities such as Pride marches, gay marriage, trans rights, abuse and other related issues, we continuously support and minister to each other and to the community on these important matters.
